Designer Assessment Checklist

This checklist can be used to assess designers and their response to the Design Brief. It highlights key areas that you should consider in reviewing proposals.

| PROPOSAL COMPLETENESS | | |
| Does the proposal cover all areas required, for example: scope of works and services statement of deliverables – the products they will submit at each stage and their level of detail sample of projects that show relevant experience programme fee schedule. | | |
| SERVICES AND PROCUREMENT | | |
| Is it clear from the scope of work and services which works will be performed by the designer and which may require other professionals, e.g., land surveyors, quantity surveyors, services engineers? | | |
| If other professionals are required is an integrated design process alongside the design team an option? | | |
| Is it clear what the designer's preferred procurement option is for construction is, i.e. will they be in charge of contract administration or not? | | |
| RESPONSE TO DESIGN BRIEF | | |
| Does the proposal demonstrate the design team has the sufficient experience and knowledge to respond to the requirements in the Design Brief? | | |
| Does the proposal include references from clients or samples of previous work that demonstrate projects with similar features, standards of quality and price for comparison (e.g., prior experience in 8 Homestar rated homes, if that is a standard the project is aiming for)? | | |
| RELATIONSHIP | | |
| Is the design team one you feel you can work with and feel comfortable talking to, expressing your doubts and ideas? | | |
| Does the proposal state exactly who will be doing the design work? | | |

| Does the design team have appropriate | | |
